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How Enterprise Low-Code Platforms Are Rewriting Digital Transformation

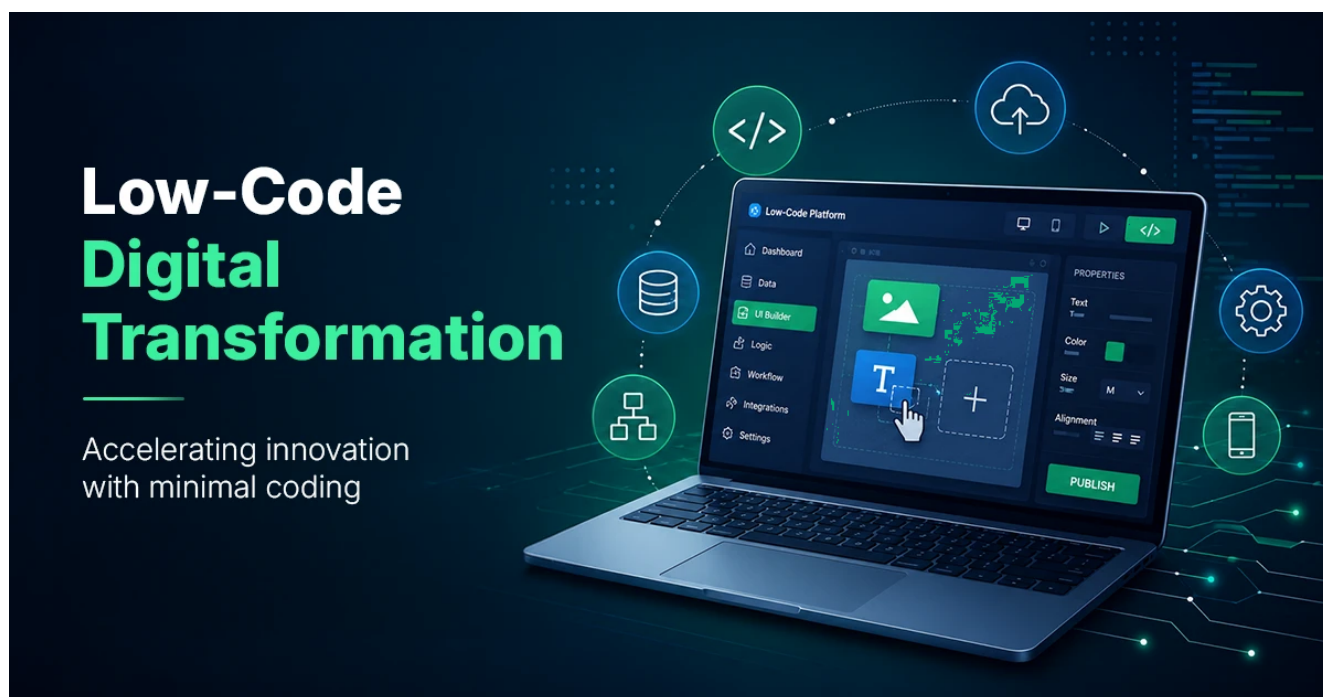

It rarely does.

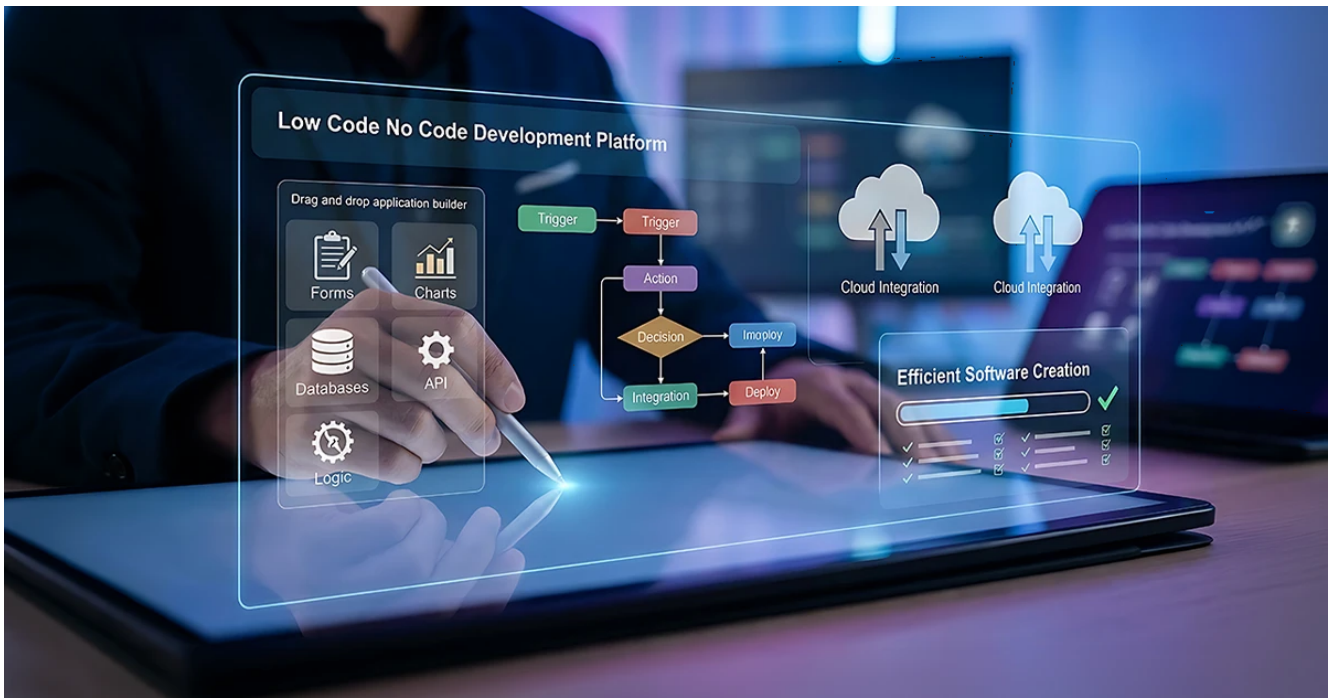
Most enterprises still rely on decades-old ERP systems, mainframes and databases containing invaluable operational data. Replacing them entirely is often expensive, disruptive and risky.
